About National Cancer Survivors Day

National Cancer Survivors Day is an annual, treasured Celebration of Life that is held in hundreds of communities around the world, on the first Sunday in June. It is a CELEBRATION for those who have survived, an INSPIRATION for those recently diagnosed, a gathering of SUPPORT for families, and an OUTREACH to the community. It is a day when people will unite to recognize cancer survivors, raise awareness of the ongoing challenges cancer survivors face, and – most importantly – celebrate life.

Who is a cancer survivor?

The National Cancer Survivors Day Foundation defines a *survivor* as anyone living with a history of cancer – from the moment of diagnosis through the remainder of life.

Min: In Celtic teachings, stones have healing qualities. They activate the power of holy wells. An estimated 2 in 5 Canadians will be diagnosed with cancer in their lifetime. June 2023 an estimated 233,900 people in Canada will be diagnosed with cancer,

Bill: Today, I put this stone in the water for every person who hears the words: "You have cancer."

All: Spirit of Life, give each strength to face the unknown, patience to go through the tests, and courage to make the best decisions.

Min: Early detection is the best protection.

Sybil: I put this stone in the water for all involved in cancer research whose life and work make early detection, careful diagnosis, and the hope of healing possible.

All: God of Many Names, guide their minds to discover the ways of cancer.

Min: The days of treatment are so long, the chemotherapy and radiation so scary, the face in the mirror is so strange.

Joan: I put this stone in the water for all persons who fight the exhaustion, the fear, the loss of

& hair and appetite; for those who fight back, who stay the course, and look fear in the face Wilson with courage and even with humor.

All: Holy One of Courage and Laughter, be near!

Min: For every person with cancer, there are family and friends who are shocked and grieving.

Floyd: I put this stone in the water for all mothers and fathers, partners, children and siblings, friends and colleagues who wait and watch.

All: Holy One on the Journey, give them strength to be with their loved one.

Min: Faith, prayer, and community are sources of help and healing.

Norma: I put this stone in the water for all the prayers and visits, the phone calls and cards, the food and kind acts that bring comfort and healing.

All: Holy One of Hospitality, surround us with community as we receive God's words: I am here with you; you are not alone.

Min: There will be a cure; there must be a cure!

Marianne: I put this stone in the water for all who believe in and work toward the day when cancer does not take the lives of God's Children.

All: Divine Healer, send your healing spirit to bring a cure for cancer now as we received your words: I am here with you; you are not alone.

One: We ask your protection and guidance for all doctors, surgeons, nurses and all medical related staff.

All: Please give them the skills and ability to take care of all our medical needs in a timely manner. Give them the determination to continue with their life saving skills, especially when they feel burned out. Let them see the light at the end of the tunnel. We thank you for blessing us with people who are willing to go above and beyond for us, when we need them.

One: Lord today I place before You those who we know are in need of your care. We quietly name them in our hearts (Silent prayer)

All: Give them the strength they need as they go through, we pray.

One: Lord, we thank you for health and the ability to still feel even if it is the aches and pains and everyday challenges.

All: Many have gone home to be with you, and no longer feel the pain. We thank you for the privilege to have known them.

One: Thank you for the blessings to be able to volunteer and play our small part in various roles.

All: Continue to use us as your vessels in our spaces this we pray in Jesus' name Amen.
