CALL TO WORSHIP

One: We praise you, O God for your redemption of the world through Jesus Christ. Today he entered the holy city of Jerusalem in triumph and was proclaimed Messiah and King by those who spread garments and branches along his way.

All: Let these branches be signs of his victory, and grant that we who carry them may follow him in the way of the cross, that dying and rising with him, we may enter into your kingdom, through Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION (in unison)

Jesus keep us near the cross, as we sing and say our hosannas today, we know they will fade into quiet indifference and even silent betrayal this week, if not today. Jesus keep us near the cross, for all the events and persons of Holy Week seem so very familiar: but praise will turn to jeers, there will be arguing about greatness, jockeying for a better place, sleeping instead of praying, the comfortable feel of thirty pieces of silver betrayal, the choosing of the other Jesus - the Barabbas's of our days, the words of denial that fit into our mouths and hearts. Forgive our weaknesses, we pray through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

All: give them the gift of healing, strength, and life.

One: You humbled yourself in the manger and you humbled yourself on the cross;

All: To you O Lord we bend our knee with those above and those below, to the glory of God the Father. Amen.
